

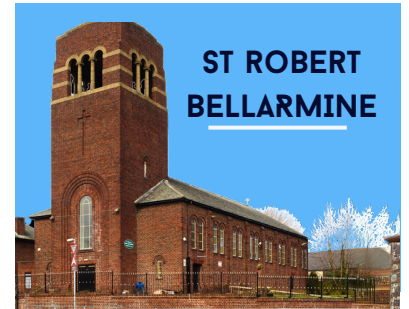

The Feast of Corpus Christi invites us to pause and reflect on one of the greatest gifts Jesus has given to His Church: the Holy Eucharist.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus speaks words that shocked many of His listeners:

“I am the living bread that came down from heaven.”

He goes on to say that whoever eats His flesh and drinks His blood will have eternal life. Some found these words difficult to accept, yet Jesus did not soften His teaching.

He wanted His followers to understand that He was giving them something far greater than a symbol or a reminder. He was giving Himself.



Every time we gather for Mass, we encounter the same Jesus who walked the roads of Galilee, died on the Cross, and rose from the dead. Under the humble appearances of bread and wine, He comes to nourish us with His own life. The Eucharist strengthens us in times of difficulty, forgives us, deepens our union with Jesus, and binds us together as one family of faith.

The Eucharist is not simply something we receive; it is a way of life. Having been fed by Jesus, we are sent out to become His presence in the world through acts of kindness, forgiveness, generosity, and service.

As we celebrate this beautiful feast, let us renew our gratitude for the gift of the Mass and ask the Lord to deepen our love for the Blessed Sacrament. May we never take for granted the privilege of receiving the Bread of Life, who remains with us always.

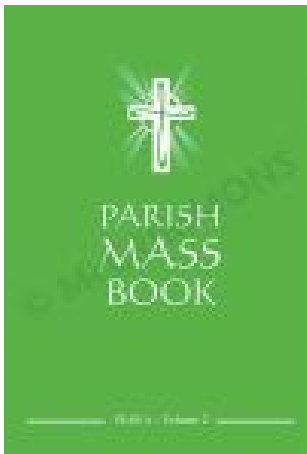

FEAST OF THE WEEK

St William of York (-1154)

St William of York, also known as William FitzHerbert, was born around 1090 into a noble family in Yorkshire. He became Treasurer of York Minster and was later appointed Archbishop of York in 1140. His appointment, however, became the centre of a bitter dispute. Some questioned the manner of his election, and opposition led by the Cistercians resulted in his removal from office. For several years William lived in exile, enduring humiliation and uncertainty with patience and faith. Eventually, after an appeal to Rome, his election was confirmed, and he was restored as Archbishop in 1153. According to tradition, when he returned to York, the crowds were so great that the Ouse Bridge partially collapsed under the weight of those who had gathered to welcome him. Miraculously, no one was killed.



William's second period as Archbishop was brief. He died on 8 June 1154, only a year after his restoration. Soon after his death, reports of miracles at his tomb led to a widespread devotion among the people of Yorkshire. He was canonised by Pope Honorius III in 1227.

St William is important because he is a model of perseverance, humility, and forgiveness. Despite suffering injustice and public criticism, he remained faithful to the Church and did not seek revenge against those who opposed him. His life reminds us that holiness is often found not in success or power but in patient endurance and trust in God.

Today, St William remains the patron saint of York, and his shrine in York Minster continues to attract pilgrims who seek his intercession and example of steadfast faith.

MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS



Pope Leo XIV has published this week his first encyclical, Magnifica Humanitas (“The Greatness of Being Human”). In it, he reflects on the gifts and challenges of modern technology, especially artificial intelligence (AI). An encyclical is an important letter from the Pope that offers teaching and guidance on matters of faith and life.

The Pope recognises that technology can do many good things. It can help people communicate, learn, work, and care for one another. However, he also reminds us that technology must always serve people and never replace them.

One of the main messages of the encyclical is that every person has a God-given dignity. We are more than information, numbers, or data. We are created in the image and likeness of God, and each of us is precious in his sight.

Pope Leo encourages us to use technology wisely and responsibly. He warns against becoming so dependent on screens and machines that we forget the importance of real relationships, kindness, prayer, and community.

Above all, the Holy Father reminds us that no machine can ever replace the human heart. Technology may be powerful, but it cannot love, forgive, show compassion, or have faith. These are gifts that come from God.

The encyclical is a message of hope. It encourages us to embrace new developments while always keeping Christ at the centre of our lives and remembering that people matter more than technology
