

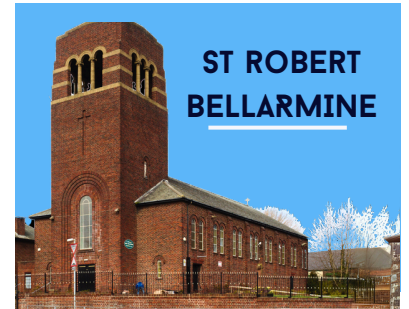

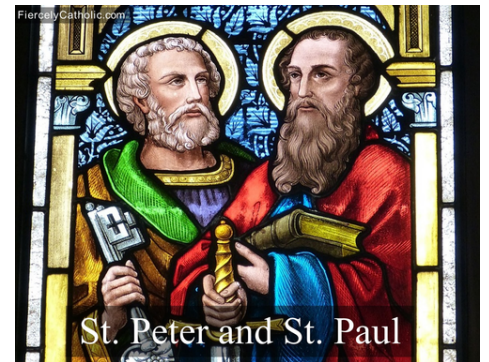

This weekend, we keep the memory of two pillars of our faith, the apostles Peter and Paul, two very different men whom God used in extraordinary ways.

Peter was a fisherman from Galilee. Impulsive, generous, and sometimes fearful, he is remembered for his great profession of faith: “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” Yet he is also remembered for denying Jesus during the Passion. Despite his weaknesses, Christ chose Peter to be the rock on which the Church would be built.



Paul, by contrast, was a learned Pharisee who initially persecuted Christians. His dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus transformed him into the Church’s greatest missionary. Through his preaching, letters, and tireless travels, he helped bring the Gospel to the wider world.

Together, Peter and Paul remind us that holiness is not about perfection but about allowing God to work through us. Peter teaches us that our failures do not have the final word. Paul shows us that no one is beyond the reach of God’s grace.

Both Apostles eventually gave their lives for Christ in Rome, bearing witness to the faith they had preached. Their courage, faithfulness, and love continue to inspire Christians throughout the world.

As we celebrate their feast, let us pray for the Church, for Pope Leo, the successor of Peter, and for the courage to share our faith with confidence and joy in our own time.

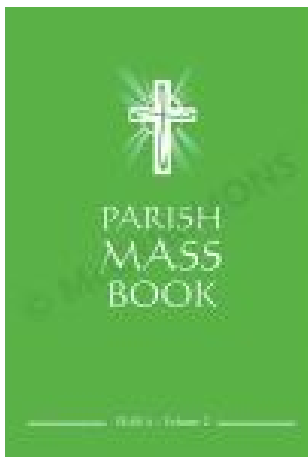

## **SALAMEH AZAR**

Fr Mark was delighted to receive some good news that, after a period of uncertainty, Salameh Azar, a seminarian from the Latin Patriarchal Seminary in Bethlehem, has been granted a visa to visit us in July.

Salameh is 26 years old and comes from the town of Beit Jala, situated just outside Bethlehem. He is currently studying for the priesthood for the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and is looking forward to spending some time with us here in the parish.



Fr Mark and Salameh will arrive home on 7 July, and Salameh will remain with us until the final week of July. During his visit, he hopes to experience the life of the Church outside the Holy Land, improve his English, and enjoy a period of rest and relaxation before continuing his formation for the priesthood.

God willing, Salameh will be ordained to the Diaconate shortly before Christmas as he enters the final stages of preparation for his priestly ordination, hopefully in the Summer of 2027. We are privileged to accompany him for a small part of that journey and to support him with our friendship and prayers.

His visit is also a reminder of some of the realities faced by Palestinians in the Holy Land. Although Salameh lives less than an hour from Tel Aviv Airport, he is not permitted to travel through it. Instead, he and Fr Mark will have to travel into Jordan and fly from Amman, adding an extra day or two to their journey. It is one of the many practical difficulties that affect everyday life for Palestinians.

Over the ten years that Fr Mark has served in Litherland, the parish has welcomed many seminarians and priests from the Holy Land. Many parishioners will remember meeting them, sharing stories with them, and supporting them with prayers and friendship. Salameh will be the last seminarian to visit the parish before Fr Mark moves to St Paul's, West Derby, in September, making this visit particularly special.

The Christian community in the Holy Land faces many challenges, and opportunities such as this are both valuable and encouraging for seminarians preparing for ministry. We hope that Salameh will feel at home among us and will take away happy memories of his time in Liverpool.

Please join us in extending a warm welcome to Salameh when he arrives. Keep him in your prayers as he continues his journey towards ordination, and please make him feel very much part of our parish family during his stay.

Everyone is warmly invited to attend. We would be delighted to see a large congregation present for this special occasion. Please make every effort to join us and help give Salameh a warm Liverpool welcome.

## FR MARK AWAY

Fr Mark is in Jordan today to attend the ordination of two new priests for the Holy Land. Today he crosses the Israeli border and will stay at the Latin Patriarchal seminary in Beit Jala, near to Bethlehem, to attend a third ordination in Ramallah later this week.

As a Canon of Jerusalem, he has the privilege of celebrating Mass in the Empty Tomb within the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the holiest place in Christendom.

As he begins his last few weeks in the parish, he will offer Mass in the Tomb for you all, in thanksgiving for his ten years in Litherland/Bootle.

Fr Mark and Salameh will return to Liverpool on 7 July.

## FEAST OF THE WEEK

### St Pier Giorgio Frassati

On Saturday the Church celebrates the feast of Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati, one of the most inspiring young saints of modern times. Born in Turin, Italy, in 1901, Pier Giorgio came from a wealthy family but chose to dedicate his life to serving the poor, the sick, and those on the margins of society.



What makes him so appealing is that he lived an ordinary life. He loved sport, mountain climbing, friendship, laughter, and spending time with others. Yet at the centre of everything was his deep love for Jesus in the Eucharist and his commitment to prayer. His faith was not something he kept private; it shaped the way he lived every day.

When he died at the age of just 24, thousands of poor people whom his family had never met came to his funeral. Only then did many realise the extent of his quiet generosity and service.

Canonised by Pope Leo in 2025, Saint Pier Giorgio reminds us that holiness is not reserved for a few extraordinary people. It is found in ordinary lives lived with extraordinary love. He shows us that faith can be joyful, adventurous, and deeply committed to serving others.

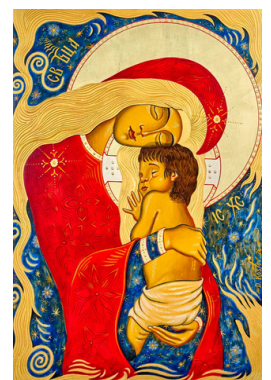
His motto was Verso l'Alto – “To the Heights.” May his example encourage us to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus and always strive for the heights of holiness.
